Topic Interview - Counseling Service in Hong Kong



Topic Interview



Information

1. What is "mental health"? How is it different from "mental illness"?

Mental health refers to emotional and psychological well-being, influenced by life experiences, impacting how we think, feel, and behave. Mental illness encompasses a wide range of disorders often the result of aberrant gene expression, environmental toxicity, head injury, or changes in brain chemistry, such as mood disorders, personality disorders, and eating disorders. Mental illnesses are recognizable conditions that can be professionally diagnosed and treated.

2. What types of mental health issues can counsellors address?

A "TOP 10" common mental health issues counsellors address include anxiety, addiction, depression, eating disorders, grief, obsessive behaviors, mood disorders, relationship problems, social anxiety, and stress. And some practitioners may elect to become a specialists in a particular field/topic area.

3. Do counsellors require a referral from a doctor or social worker? Who can request counselling services?

Counsellors do not require a referral - anyone can request counselling services. While doctors or social workers refer some clients, many self-refer.

4. When in need of professional services, what are the advantages of consulting with a counsellor compared to a social worker or psychologist?

The advantages of consulting a counsellor over a social worker or psychologist include counsellors' specific training and accreditation in dealing with mental health issues on a personal level to help solve problems. Social workers or psychologists may not further undergo the specific training for counselling skill registration.

5. How does counselling service assist individuals in need? Where can one find a counsellor?

Counselling assists by providing a supportive environment to discuss issues. Initial contacts are often through referrals, community resources, or professional registries. Training and supervised experience is required for accreditation of a psychological counsellors.

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6. Please compare the differences between social workers, counsellors, and clinical psychologists.

Community Level

1. In the 3-tier structure of the Hong Kong primary healthcare blueprint, which level do counselling services belong to? Is there any room for improvement in mental health care within the framework?

Tier 1 of Hong Kong's healthcare blueprint focuses on physical health and early detection/prevention. Counselling could be included by listing registered practitioners by specialty/location. In the existing system, the system would service its target population by its intention to include listings of clinical psychologists registered '1st contacts' for counselling advice and initial appointments. In Tiers 2 & 3, there is likewise no mention of mental health issues at all. The issues relating to the availability of supportive psychological and psychiatric appointments are included only to the extent that they "address the escalating demand" for their services. More focus on mental health is needed across all tiers.

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2. What proactive roles can counsellors play within Hong Kong healthcare system?

One of the key functions of the professional counsellor upon initial meeting with a client is to rapidly establish the extent and urgency of their presenting condition, respecting their immediate personal health & and safety, and the likelihood of obtaining success across a series of therapeutic counselling sessions and bridging clients' concern regarding their benefitting from working with a professional counsellor.

3. As the issue of student suicide becomes increasingly severe, what role can counsellors play in such incidents?

Increasing student suicide is a concern both locally and globally. Counsellors can work directly with students to explore alternative perspectives and future options to help alleviate stress/pressures.

4. Please share the collaboration between counsellors and other medical professionals such as psychiatrists, clinical psychologists, and social workers. How can they collaborate to promote comprehensive treatment and support?

Best counsellors collaborate frequently with other professionals through meetings, publications and forums to exchange views and practical experience. This promotes comprehensive, multidisciplinary treatment via professional journals and participatory online-specialist websites.

5. Do counsellors have professional standards? How can I ensure that the counsellor I seek is qualified according to professional requirements?

Yes, counsellors have professional standards. The HKSCP registry lists certification levels to verify a counsellor's qualifications. Complaint procedures are also in place to address disciplinary issues.

Service to students

1. What mindset should students have when meeting with a counsellor?

An open mind (as to procedure), and a positive attitude (as to the belief that this will help) is the most appropriate stance in prepositioning the student for the most useful beneficial outcome of therapeutic counselling. Counselling helps students learn about themselves.

2. In a school setting, what are the differences in roles between social workers, guidance teachers, and counsellors?

In schools, social workers take a holistic approach and make the necessary referrals to other professional services including but not limited to counsellors while guidance teachers focus on academics. Counsellors focus on mental/emotional health to enhance their self-awareness and ability to assess realistic options consistent with their aims and make referrals to other professionals if needed. Their roles complement each other.

3. What channels are currently available for students to access counselling services provided by counsellors?

In local schools, it would be very unusual for a student to initiate contact with a counsellor. Self-referrals are more common in international schools and universities.

4. What issues can counsellors assist students in dealing with?

With special reference to students' presentations, besides general study-skill-related difficulties (concentration, attention span, and task completion), I would identify low self-esteem, low self-efficacy, isolation (with/without social skills), victimisation (real or imagined), substance abuse (legal & illegal) and relationship problems (personal & family), as leading presentations for counsel.

5. What kind of personalities are more suitable for engaging in counselling work? How should they begin their professional development in the field of counselling?

Effective psychological counsellors have high empathy, strong active listening skills, and a non-judgmental attitude. They establish a trust to facilitate personal growth and well-being regardless of theoretical orientation. Building these core skills is key to professional development.

Project Background

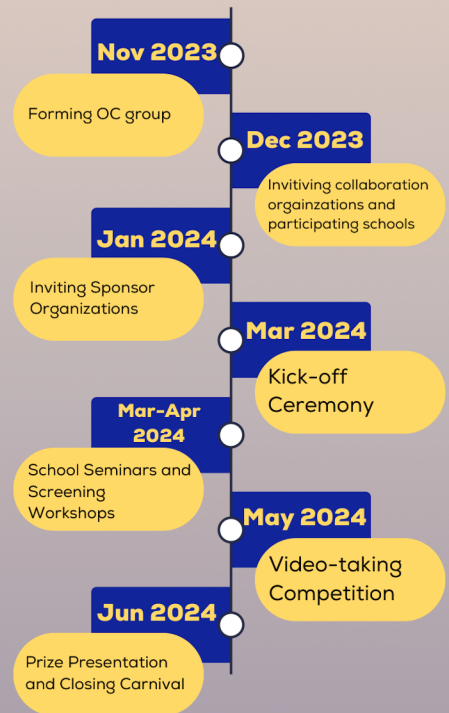

"MindShift" represents two important concepts, conveying the idea of changing mindset or thinking. It encourages individuals to seek assistance and cultivate a positive mindset, aligning with the goal of professional counseling.

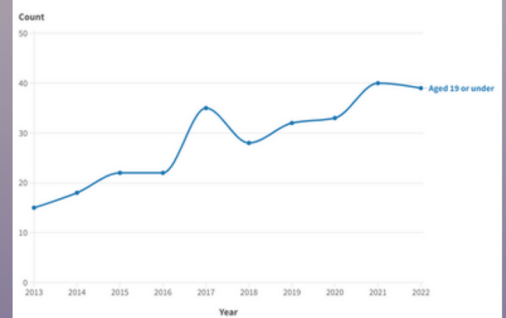
Mind: Represents the inner world and emotional well-being of adolescents, including skills in emotional management and problem-solving. Counselors can teach and guide effective emotional management techniques and problem-solving strategies. This project aims to provide supportive and protective factors in the aspect of adolescent mental health.

Shift: Represents change and growth. One of the responsibilities of counselors towards adolescents is to inspire and guide them in transforming their ways of thinking, attitudes, and behaviors, promoting their personal development and overall growth.

Lead To the Future

Project Background

Looking back to 2022, our findings from "The Future of Jobs 2020" published by the World Economic Forum, a report by **McKinsey & Company**, and our own street interviews revealed that future skills are essential for young people, yet only a few are aware of this fact. Future skills can be categorized into four groups: cognitive, interpersonal, self-leadership, and digital skills.

In our plans for the upcoming year, we aim to build upon future skills by expanding our focus beyond international companies in Hong Kong to include those in the **Greater Bay Area**. Our objective is to provide our students with exposure to opportunities beyond the Hong Kong market. In 2023, our main areas of emphasis will be **A.I.**, **Chatbot**, and **Digital Marketing**. This exploration will extend beyond the financial sector, allowing us to delve into different perspectives and insights from professionals regarding ESG trends and the execution of ESG plans.

This year, we will be organizing company visits to familiarize students with the various challenges that companies face across different industries. Additionally, we will prioritize arranging visits to the case companies for the students who make it to the final round, allowing them to gain a more precise understanding of the company's pain points and enabling them to focus more easily during their presentations. This will be facilitated through meetings with senior management.
